Member Groups' Reports

Chelmsford Member Group

27 October 2013 - Allens Green - Horror stories in the media of an impending hurricane and torrential rain must have weighed heavily on our regular riders, as there were only four of us at the start for today's ride to Allens Green. Of course, another explanation may be that they turned up at 9am BST rather than GMT! The early morning rain had stopped and we set off in bright sunshine, led by Dave on an excellent route of about 20 miles using the lanes to Hatfield Heath for elevenses. Some sections into the strong squally SW wind were quite tough.

Peter had a puncture in Hatfield Broad Oak, which he and Dave fixed in next-to-no time. At Hatfield Heath the teashop was overflowing with cyclists and there was no chance of finding a table, so we headed on to the excellent "Shed" café Sawbridgeworth.

Only Dave and I were able to continue to lunch at Allens Green, following which we headed back to Chelmsford. Rain squalls for the first 7 miles or so were not too pleasant, but with the wind behind us after Birds Green we had an enjoyable fast run back into Roxwell.

We arrived back at about 3.45pm having covered 56 miles. Martin Cockersole

17th November – Dave Southin was leading today and it was nice to see Mel with us again, and Delia, who was getting some cycling in before going to Costa Rica for Xmas, - cycling of course. We took the track to Norton Mandeville Church, which was OK. But on leaving the track, Delia's rear tyre exploded with a loud whoosh of escaping air.

This was mended, but soon punctured again needing some of Tom's duct tape to effect a repair to the tyre.

Elevenses was at "Langford Bridge Garden Centre" and then "The Moletrap" at Tourney Common for lunch.

The homeward journey was down the delightful lane to Passingford Bridge, and then Shonks Mill, Kelvedon Hatch and Blackmore for tea,

where we sampled various brews on offer. Not a great mileage, but a pleasant day out, and getting back to Chelmsford, as the rain started. **Dave Russell**

24th November - Ride to Layer-de-la-Haye - We set off from the Town Hall heading for elevenses at "Perrywoods" in Tiptree. With the annoying building work at Channels disrupting the route I would have chosen we instead went via Little Waltham to get to Terling. In Witham we took NCR 16 alongside the railway to cut through to the road to Rivenhall, thereby avoiding traffic on Braintree road. A useful cut though, but it does involve dismounting to cross the Braintree branch line.

At Tiptree our group morphed into a much larger one with a total of 13 Chelmsford riders plus half a dozen from our sister CTC group in Colchester, who joined us for the next stage. We decided that Rowhedge was a bit too far given the short daylight hours and instead headed for the "Donkey and Buskins" at Layer de la Haye, where we were very well served.

For tea we stopped on our return trip at the new "Woodlands Café" South of Tiptree, where sadly I couldn't resist the delicious lemon meringue pie despite my best intentions.

We arrived back in Chelmsford in the gathering gloom after an enjoyable 53 miles.

1st December 2013 - Ride to Great Bardfield - Brian and Jeanette on the tandem led us through Great Waltham and Littley Green towards the "Station Café" at Rayne. We made Rayne in good time. After elevenses on the cold platform outside the café at Rayne station we set off for Great Bardfield. Three riders had returned to Chelmsford but John D and Beryl had joined us so we were now a group of 11. Brian led us via Shalford on a very enjoyable route to "The Bell" for lunch where our numbers were further boosted by the arrival of Eric and Heather, meaning we had 15 members out today, including a very welcome visitor Mel from the SE Essex MG.

As we left for the return to Chelmsford, the sun burst out and we had perfect conditions for our ride home. Brian chose another excellent route via Lubberhouses Lane, Shalford, Felsted, North End and the Chignals and we reached Chelmsford at about 3.15 having covered about 50 miles. **Martin Cockersole**

8th **December** - I'll start with an apology – elevenses was at "The Shed", Sawbridgeworth, and not as I posted in the rides list: "The Hut" – a case of getting my wooden outhouses mixed up with my shacks...

Six of us set out on as good a day as you get this time of the year, facing a decidedly cool westerly breeze for the first leg, which was thankfully a mere shadow of the storm winds of the preceding week. Taking a pretty route, we arrived at "The Shed" with 23 miles clocked, running a little late. I must put in a word here for the "Santa Sandwich," a *speciality du maison* of "The Shed". This consists of hot turkey, stuffing, sausage, bacon and cranberry sauce in a "Toastie". You get a small salad too, but it would really only take a few sprouts and some gravy to make it into a full lunch. A snip at £4! John and Margaret joined us, so that made eight to go forward to lunch, taking in the very scenic and colourful track through Hatfield Forest during the best of the day's sunlight.

Its strange to reflect sometimes how life throws up little ironies: "The Cock" at HBO was "fully booked", so we had to try the "Dukes Head", where once again there was "no room at the inn". Very appropriate so near to Christmas, and ironically caused by that event itself. We backtracked to Hatfield Heath, safe in the knowledge that failing all else we could eat at the Post Office. As it turned out, we got good service, sandwiches, chips and soup at the "White Horse" ("The Stag" being closed down).

The golden afternoon faded to dusk as the group approached Writtle and lights were deployed with just a few miles left complete the day. Adrian Leeds

Colchester Member Group

November 17, 2013 -Hadleigh Ride - I arrived at Colchester Leisure World to find a healthy number of riders turned out, and to see us off, our faithful Treasurer, Emily. Twelve set off along Sportsway to dice it with the Sunday morning traffic at Essex Hall Roundabout and up Bergholt Road. Sadly, by the double mini-roundabouts Robert decided that was enough of a ride for him and turned back.

Undeterred and regrouped after the short climb, the rest carried on through West Bergholt, turning right to Welshwood Park, where at the crossroads we turned into Coach Road, which is still in bad shape. On to Langham we went, crossing the A12 and heading toward Dedham along Birchwood Road. We had a little time to spare so rather than turn left at the end, we turned right, away from Dedham toward Ardleigh.

We then turned into Hunters Chase past the resting Alpacas (on left opposite footpath), to connect with Coggeshall Road, where at the end we turned right along Long Road East, then hanging a left down Jupes Hill/Manningtree Road. Approaching Brook St and several heaps of sugar beet by the side of the road drew Steve's attention, prompting Chris to note there isn't actually a lot of sugar in sugar beet!

We cycled through Dedham playing field, via Southfields/The Drift, which I would regret, as since my last visit to Dedham, the compacted path through the park is now loose shingle. I believe a flint from this punctured my rear tyre, as it was flat by the time I rode over the kerb at the "Art & Craft Centre" ... so my elevenses was taken up by the task of replacing the pierced inner tube, but without getting filthy hands, thanks to Alison kindly giving me her latex gloves.

My only venture inside was to go to the toilet, but I was not alone outside as Duan and Steve kept me company. Clive, John, and Alison would leave us here, fearing a return home from Hadleigh in darkness. But our numbers were unchanged, as awaiting our arrival in Dedham were Sarah, Les and Gill from Tiptree.

We left Dedham along the resurfaced Mill Road, over the river Stour, out of Essex and into Suffolk. In Stratford we took the first right toward Higham, where Les and Gill on their tandem trike sadly suffered a rear puncture.



It seems to be more straight forward on a trike (the rear at least), as there is no need for any adjustment to the axle in order to remove the tyre and inner tube. After a short interlude, in which time an old dog limped over from the adjacent garden to see what all the excitement was about, we were off again! -



The New Inn, Colchester

Into Higham and the climb up to Sandpits Lane, and left onto the B1070 briefly, before turning off through Great Wenham. This was an uneventful, but fast section, as Steve and I upped the pace considerably to the next junction, with Mike and the other Steve chasing us down! This was as far east we would go, before heading briefly north along Saxon Lane and west toward Hadleigh through sleepy Chattisham.

We had the option of the Hadleigh Railway Walk (a section of Sustrans National Cycle Network), but we instead chose Clay Lane, which skirts Raydon Great Wood, arriving at "The George" at about half past one. Des, the two Steves and I lunched outside on food-from-home, while the others went inside for traditional Sunday roast. The front bar was deceptively quiet, as the restaurant at the rear was packed! As such, there was a little wait for the food, which was apparently very nice, although Pam was a little disappointed with the ale!

Over lunch, the weather changed from being dry and mild to drizzly and chilly. Hats and extra layers came out, particularly in Chris' case, with Les commenting that he had seen Arctic explorers wear less! We did a little loop from the car park of "The George" back to the High Street to take Duke Street out of Hadleigh to Lower Layham and onto Lower Raydon, where Les, Gill, and Sarah headed their own way home. "The rest of us climbed up through Brett Vale golf course, to retrace a short section from the morning.

In Higham I questioned whether we should go directly home and the overwhelming response was yes! The most direct route being through Stratford, up Gun Hill and through Boxted. We split along Boxted straight, some turning off toward Severalls Lane, while the others (myself included) continued into town past Colchester United's Community Stadium.
